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JELlicoe HOUSE – BAROSSA’S COMPLETE VINEYARD RETREAT

The Barossa has a new accommodation offering, Jellicoe House. Located in Sorby Adams Wines’ Jellicoe Vineyard in Eden Valley, the contemporary B&B is a private vineyard retreat designed to cater for the growing number of tourists seeking authentic destination experiences.

Acclaimed Sorby Adams Winemaker, Simon Adams and his wife Helen, herself a highly regarded cook, created Jellicoe House to not only showcase the best of Barossa wine and food but to enable visitors to really understand what living in the Barossa is all about.

“Our aim with Jellicoe House is to offer an experience not just accommodation. Located amongst the thirty year old Jellicoe vines including Shiraz, Riesling and Cabernet, guests have a firsthand view of the seasons of the vineyard.

“They will even be able to come and help me pick and prune if they like,” says Simon.

“We have a fully stocked cellar for guests to sample wines from the vineyard and I will be available for tasting sessions to ensure guests have a personalised experience.”

According to Simon, the jam packed pantry of staple ingredients and Helen’s gourmet meals, together with a full cook’s kitchen, means that even the most serious epicurean won’t go hungry.

“We are fortunate that our 25 acre property also includes established fruit trees and a dam full of yabbies adding to the gourmet activities for guests on a seasonal basis.”

Originally built in the 1870’s, Jellicoe House is a historic bluestone homestead that required painstaking renovations by Simon and Helen Adams to create today’s contemporary vineyard accommodation offering, able to accommodate up to eight guests.

“Both Helen and I are really proud of what we have created and to have the opportunity to encourage visitors to get to know Eden Valley, which is what we are both most passionate about,” says Simon.

“We believe Eden Valley as a destination has so much to offer, adding another dimension to the Barossa. The big gums, wildlife, undulating hills and magnificent scenery are so different to the Valley Floor.

“And of course we can’t forget the world class winemaking and viticulture occurring in the region.”

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
